
■Pole Repair:

For temporary repair of poles in the field, slide the emergency sleeve over the broken section and secure with duct tape. Contact Montbell or a local repair shop for permanent repair information and parts



Care: Improper care or storage may damage your tent and shorten its lifespan.

Maintenance and storage:

- Ony tent COMPLETLY after each use and before storage.
- ODirt can be harmful to your tent. If it becomes dirty, wash with water and air-dry completely. Do not dry clean; do not use a top-loading washing machine
- Olf the water-repellency of your tent degrades after extended use, it can be restored with a spray-on durable water repellent.
- OFor long-term storage, fold the tent body and fly loosely and store in a dry, well-ventilated area. Avoid using the stuff sack for long-term storage.

When storing for long term:

OStore tent and rain fly in a well-ventilated place and fold loosely. Avoid using the stuff-sack for storage because it is designed to compress the tent for backpacking, not storing.






Pitching instructions


Before going on a trip, pitch your tent at home to become familiar with the procedure and to ensure that you have all of the necessary parts.


1. Choosing a proper site


Select the flat, level, and protected site. Make sure the site is free of any sharp object such as rocks, roots, or twigs that may puncture the floor of the tent. You should also be aware of your impact on the environment and avoid delicate vegetation.


2. Pitching the tent (1)Spread out the tent with all hooks facing up and stake out the four corners. (2) Unfold the poles and connect them carefully. Make sure all joints are connected securely. (3) The center hooks on the tent should be aligned on the same pole. (4) Place the 4 ends of the poles in the grommets in the corner pullouts.












Drape the flysheet over the tent body. Make sure the doors are

Attach the corners of the fly to the tent body using the FasTec buckles. Adjust rain fly tension with a gentle tug of the webbing tabs.



4. Staking out your tent

You must anchor your tent to the ground or risk damage/loss due to sudden austs of wind.

Four loops high on the corners are installed for additional guy lines. Each guy line has an ultra light tension adjustment. Hook the loop of the guy line to the stakes.
